Diptych

Think about the techniques of Claes Oldenburg and Andy Warhol.

Using the sheet of black or white paper you've been given, create a diptych using your photographs. Remember, a diptych is a series of four related pieces.

You will paint and embellish the printouts in any way you wish using tempera paint, colored pencils, and markers. Encourage the students to change the background in some way using patterns, color, texture, line, etc. You do not have to completely color in the background on both of your photographs. You may also use craft and found items such as sequins, small beads, string, etc.

Finally, arrange your pictures in rows—either one horizontal or one vertical row, or two rows of two pictures each—on the pre-cut sheets of black or white paper.
