folktale: a story, usually of anonymous authorship and containing legendary elements, made and handed down orally among common people

god-mother: female godparent; A woman who acts as an advisor or mentor to someone. A person who sponsors a child, as at Baptism, and, traditionally, assumes responsibility for the child's faith

royalty: the rank, status, or power of a king or queen

step-mother: female stepparent. The person who has married one's parent after the death or divorce from the other parent

wand: a rod regarded as having magical powers, as one used by a magician or fairy

wicked: morally bad or wrong, acting or done with evil intent
